COUNCIL MEMBERS REPORTS:

Councilman Amato No Report

Councilwoman Bellinger- No Report

Councilman DiPiazza- Wants to pull Resolution No. 18-01-113 from consent agenda. Borough Attorney Paul Kaufman recommends that this should be discussed in closed session and then if satisfied with explanation then it doesn't need to be moved or if you want a separate vote at that point it's still appropriate to move. Councilman DiPiazza agrees.

Councilwoman Tedesco-Santos No Report

Councilman Verile Reports that last week the Recreation Commission along with Sue Reagan and Bob Cowper were given more information about the Base Line testing assessment evaluation protocol and they are all in favor of having all athletes signing up having to do it one time for the year. Ms. Reagan has sent out emails to adjoining towns and counties to see what they do. Ms. Reagan is also going to be discussing with Mr. D'Arco the registration fees from all sports to make sure it's included in it. Councilman Verile continues to say it was explained to the Commission that it's something that is done at home through their computer and takes about thirty minutes. Councilwoman Bellinger adds the concerns that we brought forward were about making it mandatory and with the absence of a trainer overseeing someone to actually pull the kids. Mayor and Council continue to discuss how the test works and it being mandatory or optional. Mayor LaBarbiera asks what the next step is and Councilman Verile responds for Mr. D'Arco and Sue to work out any legalities of it.

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Councilwoman Bellinger continues the one thing we should do is pay for 100 people for the doctor to keep the cost at \$10.00 each not knowing whether they're doing it or not and if more than 100 people take advantage of it we pay the additional. The Mayor and Council discuss financing and everyone is on board with trying to offer it.

Councilwoman Weber No Report

MAYOR'S REPORT: We didn't have a lot of store closures and have been reading about a lot of ribbon cuttings and in light of some of this and making sure were always watching out for the taxpayer he asked the Borough Attorney to prepare a Resolution to put on tonight's agenda. A Resolution ratifying and reaffirming the Ordinance known as the Master Plan. Mayor LaBarbiera hands out copies for everyone. Borough Attorney Paul Kaufman informs the Mayor and Council that he just received a motion for Bankruptcy Court for Toys R Us. The motion is to authorize crew for conduct for store closing sales and one of the stores is the Paramus Babies R Us on Route 17 S. Mayor LaBarbiera says we've been blessed that with every store closing we've had one opening and believes that a large part of that is attributed to the Master Plan. He continues he believes that's why he thinks it's important to ratify and reaffirm all those elements and why it's important to repurpose. The Mayor asks Borough Clerk what Resolution number he can make this and is told 18-01-114. The Mayor and Council discuss putting it on the consent or non-consent agenda and discuss Resolution. Resolution 18-01-114 is put on the non-consent agenda. Borough Attorney says if anyone wants to look at the motion he received to let him know.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT: Reports a resident is requesting that the Borough treat her driveway the same way as the sidewalks since it's the Borough's trees that have damaged her driveway. Mr. D'Arco reports we have not done that in the past and it might be more complicated if the Mayor and Council believes we should be doing something to address it. He would have to meet with Shade Tree also and have some guidelines that outline how the roots will be trimmed by the Borough. The Public Works Department does have paving equipment so we don't have to go to a contractor. Mayor LaBarbiera asks if this would come from the trust fund from Shade Tree and if you're protecting the trees and there are ramifications from doing such they're going to have to figure it out. Mr. D'Arco continues that were going to have do it on a case by case basis because the resident can say they need the whole driveway done and were not going to do that. The Mayor and Council discuss and Councilwoman Tedesco-Santos says she will discuss at the next Shade Tree meeting. Mr. D'Arco reports he met with Deena from Paul Kaufman's office about the multiple codes of conduct for Recreation and waivers for Recreation. They have been combined into two documents and he has sent them to the Council and is prepared to send them to the Recreation Commission.

BOROUGH ATTORNEY'S REPORT: Borough Attorney Paul Kaufman asks for authority to undertake appropriate research to see if what he wants to do is legal under the settlement as well as the Paramus Ordinances. The Mayor and Council approve. Mr. Kaufman continues about ABM Investments has a major sub division application and there is an impasse at the Planning Board. They want to know what the Mayor and Council want to do on the part of the applicant in terms of management system. Mr. Kaufman says he told the Borough Engineer and the Planning Board Attorney that his recommendation was to make it a condition of approval. They don't want to make a decision without the Mayor and Council. Mr. Kaufman discusses with Mayor and Council and informs them of their choices of either sending it back to the Planning Board saying make it a condition of approval and we'll address it when we negotiate the Developer's Agreement or his recommendation is to have a Home Owners Association with the cost of maintaining it because that is the least cost to the Borough. Councilman Amato believes it's not up to the Council or the Planning Board it's up to the Home Owners Association or the applicant to determine what's to be done. The Mayor and Council discuss with Mr. Kaufman further. Mr. Kaufman continues to say normally we do this in the Developers Agreement but the Planning Board wants the determination now from the Council. If he's being forced to give a recommendation now it's going to be what will cost the tax payers the least. Councilwoman Weber says the

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Borough imposes a fee when you pay by credit card for taxes or the Pool or any application and is curious why it would be questionable for the towers to ask about that fee. Mr. Kaufman answers he has to research it.

Mayor LaBarbiera opens to the public at 7:45 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Citizens are welcome to address the Mayor and Council on any governmental item of concern to them, whether or not it is scheduled on the agenda above. Comments will be made at the public portion of tonight's Public Meeting in the Council Chambers.

Andrew Kohut- 12 Route 17 North of Wells, Jaworski & Leibman representing ABM Investments. Mr. Kohut explains he went to last Planning Board meeting where he relayed the condition that it be based on Council approval. His client doesn't want to enter into a Home Owners Association and have that affect the property. His client is willing to discuss with the Borough other avenues. Mayor LaBarbiera says we're hearing you should probably go back to the Planning Board and if they see fit then you should have that next conversation. Mr. Kohut continues that the issue is that this is a residential development and because of the recent DET regulations you are required an extra filtration system. Borough Attorney Paul Kaufman explains we're just trying to help him come up with a solution and he would like to address this later once he has the advice of the Borough Engineer, DPW and Administrator. Mr. Kohut continues that Mr. TenKate did say at the last meeting that the DPW does have the ability to maintain the type of system we're proposing. Mr. D'Arco makes the suggestion of getting an estimate of the cost of maintenance and you put up a bond or a letter of credit. Mr. Kohut says he will get the Council the information that they need. Councilman Amato is told to convey this to the Board.

Mayor LaBarbiera opens to the public at 7:54 P.M.

Tom Locicero -30 Alden Road Discusses new Resolution being voted on tonight and has issue that it wasn't on the agenda saying that any resident or business owner in town knew nothing about this and what if they had concerns and questions. Mr. Locicero doesn't feel it should be voted on. Mr. Locicero continues about the concussions and feels prevention is a great idea. Councilwoman Bellinger discusses the testing. Mr. Locicero talks about towing charges and discussion ensued.

Nick Matahen- 6 Primrose Lane has a concern about the ABM Investments. Mr. Kaufman advises him he's on the Board and he should not voice any opinion on the application except at the Planning Board meeting.

Mayor LaBarbiera asks for motion to go into closed at 8:04 P.M.

OFFICE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL:

Councilman DiPiazza- The IT Department the Borough website will be going live On February 1st. Reports on projects that were done in 2017 and what projects will be done in 2018 including video surveillance at the Pool Golf Course, and Parkway Field and implementation of Fast Track Government Software for Construction and

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Health permits. Environmental is working with the DPW for Pride of Paramus Day to have multiple sites cleaned up on May 19th. The Boy and Girl Scouts also help out with this. Earth Day is April 15th from 12- 3 at the Library. The Farmers Market is moved up from May 16th to October 17th. Councilman DiPiazza mentions the Paramus Golf Course is in great condition for January.

Councilman Amato- Congratulates the five new Officers to the Paramus Police Department and thanks Sunrise Rotary for their contributions. The DPW Road Division continues to address potholes. Salt and calcium supplies have been replenished. Building and Grounds is completing renovation to the bathrooms at Borough Hall. Golf Course restaurant renovations are going well. Employment applications for the Paramus Pool Concession stand can be found online. Loose curbside leaf collection has ended for the season. Leaves can put out on Wednesdays in containers or bags. Councilman Amato continues to go over the numbers for the Building Department. The Golf Course purchase order has been processed for the 2018 water allocation permit that was received from NJDEP. A meeting was held with Boswell Engineering to review the water modification process. We will meet this week to finalize the water reporting paperwork. The mold remediation was completed in the kitchen of the restaurant at the Golf Course. The bid for the restaurant has been advertised with open scheduled date of February 21st. The Golf Course re opened on February 27th. The Library has instituted new programs for adults and goes over Youth programs. English as a Second Language classes began on January 22nd. The Library has ordered over 17,000 books and audio books in the past year. This year over 20,000 new items will be added to the collection. The Main Library renovation project is complete and final inspections were performed in January. The Community has responded to the renovation with visits doubling. The Reid Library had many new visitors while the main Library was under construction.

Councilwoman Bellinger- Over the past year the Senior Center has seen a lot of growth and now has 498 residents receiving their newsletter. Councilwomen Bellinger continues to go over club and program numbers. They have started to organize overnight trips which the Seniors seem to enjoy. They have a trip planned to Maine this June and will have monthly casino trips from April to October. They are excited about the 2018 expansion of the building and anticipate more classes to grow in numbers. The Health Department says it's not too late to get the Flu shot. Monday February 5th you can get your blood pressure checked from 9:30 A.M. to 11 A.M. and 1:30 P.M. to 3 P.M. Coping with care giver stress is a free program offered by Alzheimer's New Jersey on January 31st from 6:30 to 7:30 P.M. Bergen County Health Services is offering a free training on how to reverse an Opioid overdose on February 12th from 6:30 to 8 P.M at 1 Bergen County Plaza. Councilwoman Bellinger asks everyone to keep the Antolone family in their thoughts and prayers for their loss.

Councilman Verile- Congratulates the Paramus Rescue and thanks all Council who attended the installation. Fourth of July had their first meeting and has the dates as Sunday July 1st for the fireworks and July 4th will be the parade. July 7th will be the fire vs. police game played at the Sports Complex. Their theme this year is hash tag (#) remember why it's the Fourth of July. Councilman Verile discusses Recreation is getting bids for a new floor and redoing the Hockey Rink. Lights for the Sports Complex is on the agenda. Cultural Arts had a meeting and have sent letters for donations. Fourth of July has also sent out letters for donations.

Councilwoman Weber- Historic Committee will have a meeting in two weeks. Substance Abuse Prevention Committee hasn't had a meeting yet this year. One will probably be scheduled for some time in February. Councilwoman Weber reports she attended a session for Opioids in your Community in Atlantic City and heard many professionals speak on the fact that marijuana is definitely a gate way drug. Councilwoman Weber continues to discuss the legalizing of recreational marijuana. Councilwoman would like the Council to be proactive and have the Borough Attorney draft up an Ordinance banning the sale of marijuana in the Borough

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of Paramus. Mayor LaBarbiera says we discussed this a couple of weeks ago and thought we agreed as a Council that we were going to wait for it to play out. He thinks the Council was willing to entertain something like this but was waiting to see if it was going to become legal. The Mayor and Council continue to discuss. Mayor LaBarbiera makes the suggestion of the Council asking for impute from the Police or Board of Health and then at least in the anticipation of the State doing something then we can act swiftly. It's still illegal and when the State does something then we can do something. The Mayor and Council discuss legislation with Mr. Kaufman. Mayor LaBarbiera agrees with Councilwoman Weber that if and when the time comes that marijuana is legal we should seek to restrict within any legal means that we have and discussion ensued.

Councilwoman Tedesco-Santos- Shade Tree winter tree removal has begun and PSE&G will assist with any trees in power lines and stumps will ground when removals are complete by early Spring. The Parks Department crews are cleaning various locations and applying mulch. The assembly of the ADA Playground continues as weather permits. The pool will be hiring their new Pool manager. The Chamber of Commerce there will be a ribbon cutting at Bar Louie on Wednesday and will be hosting a ladies night at Biagio's on February 8th from 6:30 to 8:30 P.M. The Board of Education had a meeting and there have been articles about Maywood not renewing their contract with Hackensack schools. Dr. Robinson said Maywood has not contacted the Borough of Paramus. The school bus cameras on the stop signs don't have the capability and they are looking into someone to do it. Councilwoman Tedesco-Santos spoke with Chief Ehrenberg and he has implemented police officers in the mornings and afternoons to catch people going around buses. Councilwoman Tedesco-Santos reports on Police Department numbers and congratulates the five new Police Officer hires. Councilwoman Tedesco-Santos reports on Fire Department numbers and thanks the Fire Department.

Mayor LaBarbiera- Reminds everyone to wear red on Friday for women's health. Mayor LaBarbiera acknowledges the resignation of Daniel Tornatore from the Environmental Commission and re affirms Garcia as member to an unexpired term. Mayor LaBarbiera goes over additions to the agenda. Resolution No. 18-01-114 on non-consent agenda ratifying and re affirming the Master Plan. Resolution No.18-01-115 authorizing the defense of Latz litigation onto the consent agenda.
