

**PARAMUS GOLF COMMISSION  
MINUTES  
Tuesday April 6<sup>th</sup>, 2021**

**Call to order 6:30 pm by Andy Schuckers, Manager/Superintendent**

**1. Notice of meeting:**

This is a regular scheduled meeting of the Golf Commission and the notice requirements provided for the "Open Public Meetings Act" have been satisfied. Notice of this meeting was properly given in a notice which was transmitted to the Record, filed with the Clerk of the Borough of Paramus, posted in Borough Hall and posted on the Borough Website.

**6. Finance**

The course did well with rounds this month partly due to the county courses not opening. Income for the month of March was down compared to other years because the lottery was moved to April. The course will have a better idea on revenue compared to years prior after April. There was an increase in membership registrations in March because of waiting for policy changes to be approved to sell the new years membership. There has not been a significant change in the percentage of Paramus residents and nonresidents obtaining memberships from last year.

**7. General Manager/ Superintendent Report:**

The mechanic position has been filled. There are still vacancies for full time positions open at maintenance. There is also a shortage of seasonal staff for maintenance.

Friday April 9<sup>th</sup> the course will be closed for aerations until 2pm.

**8. Old Business:**

A contract is in the works with a vendor for the restaurant and will be on the next Mayor and Council Agenda.

**9. New Business:**

The Clubhouse's basement flooded due to a failed hot water heater destroying all the electric in the building, furnace and three hot water heaters. The Club house was closed for five days for safety concerns. The Club house will remain on a generator until new electric is installed.

The lottery on 4/3 had the most participation ever and was sold out to almost 12:45pm both days.

The vendor used for online tee times gave the course a two to three-week timeline for programming what PGC needs.

Rules for tee time access were sent twice to customers and was also published on the golf course website.

Vice Chairman informed Andy he received a couple complaints from residents who had issues with staff. Andy requested to all the commissioners, if someone has an issue at the course to direct these matters towards him so he can investigate and address them.

**10. Meeting open to the public:** *5 minutes maximum per person*

John Carpentiri, resident, inquired if there are still two walk in times per hour when the lottery begins. He mentioned he has never had a problem booking tee times and he has never had a miscommunication with staff.

Nancy Vasile, resident, presented the golf commission a petition for tournaments since she had heard the course was not going to conduct any this year. The petition will be sent to the golf commission and will be on next meeting agenda for discussion.

James Cullen, resident, inquired when the ball washers would be back on the course. He also asked for a timeline in regards to the new restaurant vendor.
