COUNCIL MEMBERS REPORTS:

Councilwoman Bellinger- Reports that Environmental Commission clean up day was a success and a second day is planned for September 17th. They are trying to find more volunteers for clean up and are asking if the Chamber of Commerce could help. Earth Day was also a huge success and they collected three truck loads of styrofoam. The Library had their ground breaking yesterday. Councilwoman Bellinger reports that a letter was received from Senator Lagana regarding recognition of the Armenian Genocide. She continues that he has secured funding for a statue and we just need to approve recognition and find a fitting location. Mayor LaBarbiera

thinks they should find a place where there is room for expansion. Councilwoman Bellinger says that she and Councilwoman Weber and Councilman Quintana attended the special meeting in Washington Township regarding the use of the property bordering Paramus. She says while it is their property she wants everyone to consider the impact it can have on Paramus residents.

Councilman Quintana- Discusses the meeting in Washington Township and says there were over 100 residents there saying that they didn't want the property being used for the DPW and feels they were treated unfairly at the meeting.

Councilman Antonio- Reports that the Board of Education passed their budget at 84 million and revised the school calendar to have Friday May 27th off. Mayor LaBarbiera adds that the Memorial Day service has been moved to Thursday at 1:15 now so the kids can be involved in the service.

Councilman Kaiser- Reports on Recreation that parks are ready for baseball and we are working with the DPW to cut down costs. There is an issue with gym time and we are working with the schools so outsiders don't take away from Recreation time. He believes that residents should be first and discussion ensues. Councilman Kaiser reports there was a 200 ft sewer line collapse on Norwood that was handled by the DPW instead of an outside agency that saved the Borough over \$64,000. Councilman Kaiser questions a medicinal marijuana resolution that was passed on December 21st 2021 and asks if it was researched and if any money was collected. Mayor LaBarbiera asks Borough Attorney to look into.

Councilman DiPiazza- Reports there is a Pool Commission meeting this Thursday and they are gearing up for the season. Councilman DiPiazza adds that the 4th of July Committee asks for no competition on the 4th.

Councilwoman Weber- Reports the Board of Health will be having a rabies vaccination clinic on May 5th. A free blood screening for Paramus residents was held on May 7th. Through a local public health Grant, they were reimbursed \$82,851 for quarter one expenses. Councilwoman Weber reports that Shade Tree completed the sports complex clean up and installed 2 flags. They removed several trees at the pool and removed over 200 ash trees throughout the Borough. The DPW cleanup day and Earth Day were successful. The Chamber of Commerce requests use of the Golf Course for their next monthly meeting. Mayor LaBarbiera says it would be easier if they met at the Life Safety or Recreation Building.

Joseph- 703 Route 17- OverStock Appliances says that they were asked to have the containers removed from behind his building. He says they are used as structure for the business and for storage. Mayor LaBarbiera says that outdoor storage is not permitted as it abuts a residential area. Joseph continues that the merchandise in the storage containers is for customers and there is no interior space. Mayor LaBarbiera says the most they can do is give him time to remove the containers and that they have to enforce Borough Ordinances.

Rod Alcot- Route 17- Furniture store next to Josephs asks the Mayor and Council if they can have more than 90 days to remove the containers as they have to find warehouse space. The Council agrees 90 days only with harsh fines for every day past.

Allison Kohler- Just Jersey Fest- expresses she is feeling very discouraged and explains her history with the Garden State Plaza and the 4th of July Committee. She thinks her event wouldn't compete with the towns event and asks the Council to reconsider as she's made various donations to the Borough throughout the years. Mayor LaBarbiera thanks her for all she's done for the town and wants her to continue working in Paramus but asks if she could move the date to July 4th. He continues that the Borough works very hard on this event and the Council and himself have determined they will not have a competing event that day.

Alexander Axenoff - 776 Highland Ave - was at the Washington Township meeting last week and has serious concerns for what they are planning to with the Charlie Browns location. He's concerned if Washington Township uses the property for their DPW it would devalue his property. He asks what can be done. Mayor LaBarbiera responds they will continue to represent the residents and do whatever they can, but feels the County will have more say and influence than anyone else. They discuss the budget that Washington Township has for the project. Mr. Axenoff asks if anything can be done from the Municipal level. He says that their town is saying that there are many options for the property and he wants to be able to see what those options are. Councilman DiPiazza asks Mr. Giblin if he can describe the process of it going to the County to see if we can challenge it some way. Mr. Giblin says the County will have jurisdiction over it since it's a County road and they will determine if whatever is proposed to be there is safe. He adds that we can have our engineer review whatever is submitted to County and maybe propose a different alternative. Councilwoman Bellinger says she thinks it's important we try to have conversations with some of their professionals and Council to make it work for everyone involved and still make it work for their Borough.

Mayor LaBarbiera exits meeting at 8:00 PM and defers to Council President Weber to chair.

Councilman Quintata says the residents aren't stopping and they just added an additional 50 signs saying no DPW. Mr. Axenoff says they have an online petition that now has over 700 signatures as well. Councilwoman Bellinger says that the water supply to that property comes from Paramus and asks if we can do anything from that angle. She is told it is a sewer line. Mr. Axenoff thanks the Council for their time.

Mr. Giblin suggests making Councilman DiPiazza chair since Councilwoman Weber is present on the phone.

Bill Holzman- 163 Morningside Road says they want the gyms and the school's facilities to be used as much as possible by the public and residents. He continues that if the Council feels its not moving quickly enough to please reach out to him or Councilman Antonio.
